Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Ashes show our need for Jesus.

Ash Wednesday falls on February 10th this year and that day marks the beginning of the season of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, Christians receive ashes upon their forehead to serve as a symbol of our repentance and of our mortality. This symbolism shows our need for Jesus and for the forgiveness and life He freely provides. As the ashes are placed upon our foreheads, we hear these words from Genesis 3:19: *"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."*

When we leave the church grounds on Ash Wednesday, many of us will go to public places, such as the mall or a department store. The ashes can serve as an evangelism tool. Some people may ask you, "What is that on your head?" And you can respond and talk about how Jesus has saved you from your sins.

Eventually, everyone who wears the ashes will wash them off. As we all wash off the ashes from our foreheads, we remember our baptism and the sense of cleansing and relief thanks to Jesus Christ's death and resurrection.

When Ash Wednesday is over, we continue through the 40 days of Lent that leads up to Holy Week. These 40 days are solemn in preparation for Easter. Many of us will fast, or give up an earthly desire during Lent. Lent's 40 days symbolizes the 40 days that Jesus was tempted by Satan in the wilderness.

When Easter arrives, we again remember what Christ has done for us by his glorious resurrection. And at Christ's second coming, we will have a resurrection like His.



Praise to Him who showers blessings on us daily! We have counted and totaled the numbers that we have recorded during our sewing and tying quilts and found to our amazement, if our math is correct, that the total exceeds any year-end total yet!!! Praise Him again!

To the Lutheran World Relief, we sent 49 quilts and five blankets in the spring and another 581 quilts in the fall. The Salvation Army received 10 quilts and one lap robe while the Shelter House was given 105 quilts. Six more quilts, made in one day, went to the Mission Auction, and 20 quilts were sent to the LWML Convention for Orphan Grain Train. abdominal cramps, nausea or vomiting, occasional muscle aches/headache and low-grade fever. The most common way to develop viral gastroenteritis — often called stomach flu — is through contact with an infected person or by ingesting contaminated food or water. If you're otherwise healthy, you'll likely recover without complications. But for infants, older adults, and people with compromised immune systems, viral gastroenteritis can very serious.

There's no effective treatment for viral gastroenteritis, so prevention is key. In addition to *avoiding food and water that may be contaminated*, thorough and *frequent hand-washings* are your best defense. Depending on the cause, viral gastroenteritis symptoms may appear within one to three days after you're infected and can range from mild to severe. Symptoms usually last just a day or two, but occasionally they may persist as long as 10 days.

Adults - call your doctor if:

Not keeping liquids down for 24 hoursVomiting for more than two days	• Dehydration —excessive thirst, dry mouth, deep yellow urine or little or no
Fever above 104 F (40 C)Blood in vomit/stool	urine, and severe weakness, dizziness or lightheadedness

Infants and children

See your doctor right away if your infant/child:

There's often no specific medical treatment for viral gastroenteritis. Antibiotics aren't effective against viruses, and overusing them can contribute to the development of antibiotic-resistant strains of bacteria. Treatment initially consists of self-care measures.



Home treatment and dehydration prevention:

- Let your stomach settle. Stop eating solid foods for a few hours.
- Try sucking on ice chips or taking small sips of water. You might also try drinking clear soda, clear broths, or noncaffeinated sports drinks. Drink plenty of liquid every day, taking small, frequent sips.
- Ease back into eating. Gradually begin to eat bland, easy-to-digest foods, such as soda crackers, toast, gelatin, bananas, rice and chicken. Stop eating if your nausea returns.
- Avoid certain foods and substances until you feel better. These include dairy products, caffeine, alcohol, nicotine, and fatty or highly seasoned foods.



- Get plenty of rest. The illness and dehydration may have made you weak and tired.
- **Be cautious with medications.** Use many medications, such as ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin IB, others), sparingly if at all. They can make your stomach more upset. Use acetaminophen (Tylenol, others) cautiously; it sometimes can cause liver toxicity, especially in children. Don't give aspirin to children or teens because of the risk of Reye's syndrome, a rare, but potentially fatal disease. Before choosing a pain reliever or fever reducer discuss with your child's pediatrician.

Home treatment for infants and children

- Help your child rehydrate. Give your child an oral rehydration solution, available at pharmacies without a prescription. Talk to your doctor if you have questions about how to use it. Don't give your child plain water in children with gastroenteritis, water isn't absorbed well and won't adequately replace lost electrolytes. Avoid giving your child apple juice for rehydration it can make diarrhea worse.
- Get your child back to a normal diet slowly. Gradually introduce bland, easy-to-digest foods, such as toast, rice, bananas and potatoes.
- Avoid certain foods. Don't give your child dairy products or sugary foods, such as ice cream, sodas and candy. These can make diarrhea worse.
- Make sure your child gets plenty of rest. The illness and dehydration may have made your child weak and tired.
- Avoid giving your child over-the-counter anti-diarrheal medications, unless advised by your doctor. They can make it harder for your child's body to eliminate the virus.

If you have a sick infant, let your baby's stomach rest for 15 to 20 minutes after vomiting or a bout of diarrhea, then offer small amounts of liquid. If you're breast-feeding, let your baby nurse. If your baby is bottle-fed, offer a small amount of an oral rehydration solution or regular formula. Don't dilute your baby's already-prepared formula.

20*t*20 UPDATE

In 2012 we set out on a journey we have called Vision 20/20. Through the years, several committees have been formed and some dissolved. Good work has been done. A lot of effort and energy has been poured into this project by many. The entire roof of Our

Redeemer has been replaced. It was just a year ago that our sanctuary sat stripped of carpeting, pews, and well, everything. As the sanctuary took shape, smiles dawned upon many faces. There was an excitement in the air.

As we moved back into the sanctuary, we began a round of five presentations on the vision of 20t 20. The scope was broad and the cost was high. Following the presentations surveys and in-person interviews were conducted by Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF). At the end of June, LCEF gave a presentation on their compiled results. Several conclusions stood out:

- Youth ministry was very important.
- There were concerns and questions about preschool.
- The gymnasium was out.


But this was not the end of the Vision 20 *t* 20 journey. We must keep our eye on the future. By the end of summer, the Vision 20 *t* 20 steering committee was regrouping and re-planning, keeping these points in mind. It was then that 512 S. 1st Avenue was purchased. 110 people attended the Voters' Meeting, and all 110 people voted to purchase the property. Through the Fall and early Winter, renovations were made to the property. At the first of this year, Pastor Hartwig moved from 440 to 512, and now we are in the process of cleaning up and painting 440 to prepare for Vicar Adelsen's occupancy.



Other changes continue at church. Notice that the inside handles of the sanctuary and fellowship hall have been removed and push plates added. Following the removal of the black marks on the stairs, the stairways are getting new grip tape installed.



This is all part of Vision 20/20. Vision 20/20 was not simply one design, but what you saw last year was a mile marker in this journey. When Walt Disney built Disneyland in 1955 it was plan number 17. Sixteen different designs were discarded along the way. Please plan to join the Vision 20 t 20 team for presentations that will be forthcoming this Spring to explain the new proposal. We must keep our "Eye on the Future."



Current preschool families will have the first opportunity to register for the school year of 2016-2017. Registrations will be handed out in February. Further information will be coming soon.




