

# Student Aid



Guidelines to Submit Application to Iowa East District LWML for Student Aid

Student Aid will be awarded in amounts announced by the LWML — Iowa East District. A committee of four will consider the applications for Student Aid. The LWML Student Aid will be disbursed directly to the institution in which the applicant has enrolled and will work as a supplement to any other financial aid.

<u>Eligibility</u> 1. Each applicant must be a member of a congregation with Iowa East District of the Lutheran Church — Missouri Synod. 2. Each applicant must be a high school graduate who has enrolled and been accepted at any LCMS synodical training school and who is preparing for full-time professional work in the LCMS.

Application Procedure Applications for Student Aid must be in the hands of the Chairman of the LWML Student Aid Committee by May 1 of each year. Recipients will be notified by June 15 of each year. 
Thank You!
