Silent Auction for Preschool - TODAY!



Bach's "Magnificat" is a musical setting of the Biblical Canticle of Mary, believed to be Mary's response to the announcement by the angel Gabriel that she is to become the mother of the Savior. Bach wrote his "Ascension Oratorio" in 1735, based on the gospels of Luke, Mark, and Acts of the Apostles.


