ISRAEL: THE LAND OF MILK AND HONEY

October 2-16, November 20-December 18 Sunday Mornings (9 sessions) 9:30 am - 10:15 am

The Holy Land has a long and varied history. The Patriarchs, the Judges, the Kings, the divided nation, the Assyrian exile, the Babylonian exile, and the homecoming of Judah under Cyrus the Persian, which is the majority of the Old Testament, happened between the Mediterranean Sea and the Jordan River. This same land is the background for Jesus' ministry.

For two weeks in August, Pastor Hartwig traveled to Israel as a part of his doctorate classwork.

Throughout the autumn and winter months, he will share with the congregation what he learned and intertwine that with God's Word.

This Bible study will feature what he saw throughout each day in the Holy Land. Some discussion topics could include: Bethlehem, Jericho, Qumran, Dead Sea, Negev, Galilee, Golan, Capernaum, Mount of Beatitudes, Caesarea Philippi, Nimrod's Castle, Mount of Olives, Sanhedrin tombs, Jaffa Gate, Hezekiah's Wall, Dead Sea Scrolls, Western Wall, Bethesda and the Chapel of the Holy Sepulcher.



5:00am Gilbert Street, Burlington Street to Washington Street





THEOLOGY 101

The word theology is derived from two Greek words: *Theos* (God) and *Logos* (work, speech, or reason). Therefore, theology in its simplest terms is rational discussion about God. It has been described as "the science of God and his relationship to man and the world" and "the attempt to reduce religious truth to an organized system."

In this book, the author presents the basic teachings of the Christian faith from the Lutheran framework. At the conclusion of the seven rounds, total scores are added up and a traveling trophy is awarded to the winning team.

... October is a wonderful time for God's people to share their appreciation for Pastors. It's an excellent opportunity to express the respect, appreciation and admiration you have for your pastor(s) and for the work they do. With the month of October having been identified as Pastor



Appreciation month you have a reminder to think either individually, as a small group (perhaps your Bible Study group), and/or as the entire congregation, as you plan for activities and gestures to encourage your pastors, demonstrating your love for them. This is not to say that other roles and activities of ministry are not important and worthy of appreciation, but in October, we take the time to specifically honor Pastors and thank God for them.

It has been suggested that Pastoral ministry involves activity in at least 13 different "task clusters" (i.e. Administration, Care-giving, Rituals and Sacraments, Management, Communication, Preaching, Public Worship, etc.) which require 64 personal competencies. Now, you and I know that Pastors are human, and no one is "excellent" in every one of these specific competencies, but the importance of the work means that your Pastor(s) are making efforts in each of them. Many of these efforts happen in quiet, confidential, and private ways. It could not be otherwise. As a result, there is much which is accomplished in Pastoral ministry of which you are unaware until/unless it intersects with you and your family, and it can be difficult for him to know of the support and affirmation of the people he's called to serve. Please consider regularly providing support and affirmation for your pastor(s), and especially in October-Pastor Appreciation Month

We can encourage Pastor Hartwig and Vicar Wolfgram in many ways. On the weekend of October 23, baskets will be set out for cards, notes of encouragement, or small gifts.


