



- ◆ those who think they know your name, but because you’re wearing your name tag, they can be sure of it.





Invest for the future and save money for the church at the same time!

Our Redeemer saves money on the loan that will be assumed when the major construction gets underway if we can produce at least 70 investors from the congregation. Not only are the loan fees waived by attaining the first level (worth at least \$7500 in savings), but depending on the tier, a rebate on the loan rate saves money over the life of the loan.

Below is a chart that shows the number of investors needed for each rebate level. Currently there are 46 investors and 24 more would be needed to reach level one (as of October 18).

0.250%	7.5%	70	24
0.375%	15%	139	93
0.500%	25%	231	185

Investments have very competitive rates, particularly for the young investors or first time investors. See chart to the left. As little as \$25 opens an account for your kids or grandkids. Even if the grandkids do not go to Our Redeemer they count—just list Our Redeemer as the member congregation. Each child counts as one investor and husband and wife count as two on either a joint account or if they choose to invest separately.



A Life of Service

Whatever our position or status in life we are called to share God’s love in acts of service to all people. “Love your neighbor as yourself” is a command that reaches out to everyone. Paul, in Galatians 6:10, exhorts His readers, *“So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith.”*

The Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) put his good intentions into action. He not only gave his money, but, more important, he freely invested himself into the well-being of the injured person. As a servant, he was able to sublimate his needs to the one he was serving. When the time comes, we, too, will need to “get off our donkeys and do something.” Helping may mean more than calling 911. We may need to get involved, get our hands dirty, and go the extra mile. God may want us to be willing to move out of the limelight into the shadows and suffer some inconvenience in order to be somebody’s servant. He may request that we help others in work that seems menial, tiresome, dirty, and ill-timed. Willingness to serve God means that we are prepared to do the small things or the large things—it makes no difference. Whenever any opportunity to serve presents itself we need to be ready.
