Dear brothers and sister in Christ –

Tonight, I sit in the state of Florida. Earlier this week, the temperatures were in the 80s, and the sun was shining brightly. Back home, you were getting eight inches of snow. At almost the same time, my brother in Reno, Nevada, received seventeen inches of snow and was expecting another foot before the end of the day.

As I pondered this, I had an epiphany. It became abundantly clear that our surroundings have a significant impact upon us. This revelation is not startling. We all know it, yet it struck me how easily and how quickly our environment changes us.

Out-of-sight and out-of-mind. It is easy to forget how cold it was at home. Out-of-sight and out-of-mind. It is easy to feel like the Florida winters are cold and uncomfortable when it reaches the lows of 40s and highs of 60s. Out-of-sight and out of mind. It is easy to focus on *OUR* reality and forget *THE* reality.

This is the reason why the Bible tells us to "fix our eyes on Jesus." (Hebrews 12:2). Because there are so many other things upon which we can fix our eyes, the Bible calls us to fix our eyes on Jesus. If we do not fix on eyes upon Him, we will fix them upon something.

So how do we fix our eyes upon Jesus?

- We attend church (online or in-person).
- We attend Bible studies.
- We faithfully pray to God (when we wake up, before meals, and go to bed)
- We meditate upon His Word, day and night.
- We participate in the life of the church by giving some of our life to the church.

As we focus on going to all the world to preach the Gospel, I pray that you keep your eyes focused on Jesus. As you respond, "Here I am," I pray that you will be looking at Jesus. For when we take our eyes off of Jesus, we will be influenced to believe something else. It is too easy in our lives of business to have Jesus be out-of-sight and out-of-mind.



PSALM 46 – "BE STILL AND KNOW THAT I AM GOD". We all know that part of Psalm 46, but read carefully the words that follow to complete that verse –

"I WILL BE EXALTED AMONG THE NATIONS, I WILL BE EXALTED IN THE EARTH.

THE LORD ALMIGHTY IS WITH US; THE GOD OF JACOB IS OUR REFUGE."

Throughout the summer and even now, America's streets fill with loud and many times violent Human Rights protests and it can be tempting to get caught up ourselves and join in the chaos and noise. Protests, in America, are considered one of our basic rights as long as they remain peaceful. *The question is: How is your Protest Posture?*

I was reading an article by Alveda King, niece of Martin Luther King, an extremely strong ProLife woman and her thoughts about how her Uncle, Martin Luther King, and 40 Days for Life use the most effective method to protest for human rights. Yes, the discussion has now realized that abortion is really a Right to Life Human Rights Issue. The Right to Life is first given by our God and then, in our Bill of Rights, is protected. Abortion takes that Human Right away by death.

During the Human Rights Protest of the 1950's and 60's, some of us remember vivid images of Reverend King leading large nonviolent groups which many times ended their marches by sitting down nonviolently which spoke silent volumes of Truth to the government and to the citizens of America. During 2020, 40 Days groups stood silently in prayer in front of abortion centers to save Pre-Born Babies in an all-time high of 588 locations! One of these locations was the Emma Goldman Clinic here in Iowa City. God acted and many Pre-Born Babies were saved, clinicians quit their jobs at the clinics, abortion clinics were closed and the sorrow and regret for all those moms, dads, and families was avoided by the Grace of God.



Stephen Ministry

We care, Christ cures.

Stephen Ministers are well-trained and supervised lay caregivers who provide one-to-one, distinctively Christian care to individuals experiencing a crisis or going through a difficult time in life. They have been recruited and carefully selected based on their gifts, abilities, and passion for care.

Stephen Ministers provide excellent care and support to people whose basic coping skills are generally intact. Their care receivers are probably capable of overcoming the challenges they face on their own—but benefit greatly from having someone to walk alongside them, encourage them, pray with and for them, and share their burdens.

Each Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time (men are matched with men, women with women) and meet with that person on a regular basis to listen, care, empathize, pray, and provide emotional and spiritual support. A caring relationship continues for as long as the care receiver's need persists.

Stephen Ministers do not seek out their own care receivers. Rather, Pastor Hartwig matches them with people in need of care.

If you have questions about the work of the Stephen Ministers, feel free to talk to one of the Stephen Leaders or Stephen Ministers.

Could you or someone you know benefit from the care of a Stephen Minister? To receive a Stephen Minister's care, call Pastor Hartwig and tell him about your situation. Pastor will help you decide whether or not Stephen Ministry would be a good move for you.

Greetings to you all in the name of Jesus Christ, who comes to us!

As you probably know, "Let it snow, Let it snow!" is a popular Christmas time song that rings during this time of year. For so many people, and also for myself, snowflakes and a fresh layer of snow are associated strongly with Christmas celebration. Moreover, I don't think I have ever run into someone who doesn't love to have some fresh snow on Christmas Eve or Christmas day. We have missed our friends from Seminary and home. And it has been an adjustment for me transitioning from student life (a life that I have had every year of my life that I can remember) to the working life that ebbs and flows and forces you to be flexible (but I still don't miss papers and tests).

However, there have also been many changes that have been a real joy for Amelia and I. It truthfully has been a great joy in the months since our marriage in June to do our lives together here in Hickory, to spend a lot of quality time, and get to know each other even more. the love and amazing generosity the members have shown us so far here. Lastly, we are thankful for still being able to worship safely in person during Covid.


