





Panama FORO Projects as of October 2021

Following are current needs in IELPA ministry centers for partners and volunteer groups to consider. We would like to stress that although these projects are "infrastructure", the only reason we want to do them is to facilitate an evangelistic outreach ministry to the communities we serve.

Redeemer Balboa (South of Panama City)

Work has started on repairing the tower area and inspecting the sanctuary roof for structural damage. With the support of LCMS World Relief, we have the funds to completely replace the roof on the rest of the parsonage, the walkway and the sanctuary. There are also funds for major renovation in the parsonage to make it suitable for a missionary family to live there.



However, there are a number of projects that could be done by volunteer groups. The windows in the parsonage building need to be replaced, since the wooden windows have totally deteriorated over the past 75 years since they were installed. The drop ceiling needs to be replaced along with the tile flooring in one of the rooms. There are considerable plumbing and electrical items that need to be fixed if there are volunteers equipped to do that type of work. An immediate need is the evaluation of the electrical system in the parsonage to update the wiring.

Funds/Resources Needed: Teams for labor and materials.

Lutheran Mission Los Andes (North of Panama City)

Pastor Raphael is anxious to get the sanctuary in shape for public worship now that Panama has loosened the restrictions on in-person worship services. The building needs to be prepped and painted inside and out. The internal work can be done now in the rainy season, but the outside should be done during the dry season starting in January. Given the height of the walls, scaffolding will have to be used both inside and out. Following is an estimate of the amount of paint it will require:

- 15 gallons interior paint
- 20 gallons of exterior paint
- Paint brushes, rollers, etc.

The sanctuary also needs some repair on the lighting and electrical systems and the parsonage requires replacement of more panels on the roof.

Funds/Resources Needed: Teams for labor and materials.

Loma Cova Project (West of Panama City)

This project to provide a salary for a full-time pastor was initially to be funded by the FORO members for 18 months at a cost of \$600 per month, with the congregation of Dios Es Grande contributing \$250 per month as well as paying for internet, electricity and water for the parsonage apartment. The FORO partners have so far sent a total of \$6,470 for the project (transfers of \$1,000, 4,190 & 1,280). Through November, we will have had to use funds from another project area to cover a deficit of roughly \$2,900 pledged by the FORO partners. The total amount needed from the project was less than the initial projected total because we were not paying the pastor transportation allowance due to the pandemic and lack of ability to visit Loma Cova for so many months.

To continue the project, we would need the \$2,900 to cover that current deficit and reimburse the funds to the designated project where we got them; and going forward the cost for the FORO partners to maintain Pastor Patricio working and living in Loma Cova would be \$600 per month. The congregation has been faithfully paying their portion and say they will continue to do so.

The ministry in Loma Cova is starting to gain steam and change for the better by having Pastor Patricio living and working in the community. We pray that this project can continue as the congregation grows and becomes able to contribute more to their pastor's sustenance. We thank the FORO partners for their prayers and support and their partnership in this ministry. With shortfall to this point, transfer/admin fees, Panamanian government requirements for employment, etc., there remains a need to fulfill project.

Funds Needed to fulfill 18-month commitment of project and shortfall: \$5,650

Sabanitas (East of Colon)

Pandemic restrictions made regular visits to Sabanitas impossible. As a result, further damage has occurred to the roof. Sheets of metal need to be replaced for the roof, wooden sub-roofing is rotted, and a few plumbing issues exist. At least in part, a local team will need to be brought in with scaffolding and other equipment. With repairs, possibility exists to rent out the property.

Funds Needed: \$3,000

Evangelism Funds

In an effort to reach out to the local communities where our congregations are located, la IELPA would also like to put before the partners a suggestion to have a ministry fund that the pastors of la IELPA could use to assist in ministry activities. The idea of this fund would be to provide funds for activities, supplies, travel, evangelism materials, equipment for workshops, food, and other costs associated with evangelism and ministry. Pastors could present their ministry plans to the national church with a stated amount for approval. Ministry activities and expenses related to such activities would be reported to the FORO partners at regular intervals.

Funds Needed: \$6,000




