Some Igloo Facts

•The igloo or iglu is the traditional shelter of Inuit living in the far northern regions. They are built of blocks of snow in a circular form in which the walls curve inward toward the top to form a snow vault in which the arched ceiling is self-supporting.

- •A skilled igloo maker can build one in 30 minutes.
- •The Inuit, better known to many as Eskimos, invented the igloo centuries ago.
- •The best snow to use is wind packed snow.
- •Some igloos can have windows built from a block of ice.
- •An igloo could be any size, but normally, they are built just big enough for the family.
- •A properly built igloo can withstand hurricane force wind on the open snow.
