Dear brothers and sisters in Christ -

This was a lesson that I learned in a management training course at Disney University. Going through the management training program, this lesson stands out in my mind still today.

The instructor pointed over to the Bunn coffee maker and on the hot plate, there it sat. It had an orange plastic handle and ring around the top with a pouring spout. The clear glass was imprinted with the Bunn company logo and revealed the dark colored coffee contained inside. Pointing, the instructor asked, what is that. Well, even the most casual observer responded, "A pot of coffee." We have seen that in every break room and every roadside café. Can't you just see Alice, better yet, Flo from the TV show "Alice" wondering around the restaurant swinging her decanter of coffee. Regular? Or Decaf?

Then the instructor walked over to the coffee pot, picked it up, and asked, "Who needs a refill?" To the left side of the room someone shouted, "Me!" The instructor walked over and tipped the decanter and nothing poured out. It was still black on the inside. Then the instructor said, "Things are not always what they seem!"

Most of the people at the Chicago Children's Hospital did not know her name. They just knew her as the sweet, elderly lady in the vivid red suit who wanted to make sure that every sick child had a teddy bear to hug and caress. She kept bringing the stuffed animals, purchased with her own money. That is why she was simply called "The Teddy Bear Lady."

Her name was Gladys Holm, a retired secretary for an insurance company, who lived alone in a tiny apartment. She lived modestly and frugally, and loved to save and invest – for the purpose of giving and helping people, especially sick children. When she died at age 86, her will simply directed that the bulk of her estate be given to the Children's Memorial Hospital in the amount of \$18 million!

No one had the slightest idea that the tall, happy woman delivering teddy bears to ailing children had such wealth. It was then, they also learned that the gifts of teddy bears were really a ruse. She gave away teddy bears to learn more about the financial resources of families of the children. When she learned that the parents did not have enough to cover medical expenses, she very quietly paid their bills.

Things are not always what they seem!

The coffee pot was not filled with coffee, but was coated with black paint on the inside of the glass decanter. The reality is that the teddy bears were only a ruse. Her real purpose was to find financially needy families.

The same can be said about Jesus and the cross. Locked in the upper room because they feared for their lives, the disciples could not see the reality that Jesus' death was God's plan, was the fulfillment of all the prophetic prophecies, was the payment by Jesus, Our Redeemer. His death actually happened, but death could not hold Jesus.





TREASURER'S REPORT

- Total income was 773K and we predicted 778K
- Total expenses were 732K
- Despite some justifiable maintenance overages, our expenses were significantly lower than budgeted.
- We have a positive surplus of 40K for FY 21. This is being set aside to cover the cost of fixing the sinking footings at the parsonage. The surplus will be added to the principle of our loan.
- We have reduced our loans to 173K on 512 property and 4514K for Vision 2020. Over a million has been paid for the Vision 2020 project.
- We will be able to reduce the principle of our loan by an additional 40K in the first quarter of FY22.
- An accountant was hired temporarily to review all financials and were determined to be in fine fiscal shape.

With overages and funds from other sources, MOTION: the Board of Directors unanimously approved using the dollars, totaling \$82,027.47, to apply to the principal of the loan.

- Completed the application process for a new Vicar for 2022-23.
- Will offer CPR training for Elders and ushers.

CHURCH PROPERTIES

- The chair leg tips were replaced recently with tremendous help from church members
- Several small projects were completed
- A structural problem has developed at the Parsonage and will require repair soon. Anticipating an extra non budgeted expense,
 - MOTION: the Board of Directors unanimously voted to modify the previous motion by holding back 40K to pay for the project.
- Major updates and improvements to Vicarage House
- Cleaning up duct work in the church building was done, mold was mediated. Will proactively clean ducts on a four-year rotation.

We enjoyed seeing brothers, sisters, children, especially grandchildren and Vance's Mother.




While visiting our daughter in Jackson, MS, we shared a presentation with Christ Lutheran Church and enjoyed meeting Pastor Fields and the people there. We also shared a presentation and were welcomed by Pastor Hageman and old friends at Trinity, Garden City, KS. Finally, while visiting our son, we shared with his church, St. James, Chicago, and Pastor Hess. We look forward to many more church visits when we return this summer. We are working out our itinerary now.

Please pray for us, praising God for His presence throughout the world and His protecting angels, thanking Him for the encouragement of family and friends and asking Him to begin opening doors for our return visits.

New Class in a Semester

We started a new semester on January 24. Vance is teaching several classes he has taught before: New Testament Introduction, Homiletics II, Lutheran Confessions and Symbolics (comparing the teachings of different churches). A new class is Pauline Epistles. He is still working to prepare all the materials for this class.

Some of these classes are larger, such as New Testament Introduction, which has 26 students, and so three of these classes meet in our new classroom which is larger than the



others. This means we no longer need to rearrange tables and chairs in chapel each day to hold classes there.

Please pray for us, praising God for the working of His word, thanking Him for students with open hearts and minds, and asking Him to make all of us effective teachers and preachers of the gospel.

Back with Books

While returning from the U.S., we were able to bring back some of the books which have been



purchased for use here. There are several hundred pounds of them all together so we had to prioritize which were needed first and which could fit into our luggage. One book is

a New Testament Introduction, which is now being used for the class Vance is teaching. Another is a Bible handbook which those who are graduating this year will take with them. We brought some of the inexpensive Bibles and most of those have already been bought, for \$1 each, by students who had none.

We are looking forward to a visit by our son and wife next week who will be bringing more with them.

Please pray for us, praising God for His inspired word, thanking Him for providing the resources we need and asking Him to lead us to make wise use of them all.

Bible reflection

This past Christmas, people may have gotten various kinds of gifts. Some, like clothing or jewelry are for the receiver herself to use and are intended to make her look good.

Others, like food or artwork, can be kept to oneself or shared with others so they can enjoy them also. Some gifts, like many games, are worthless unless they are enjoyed along with others.

Paul, in his first letter to the Corinthians, includes a long discussion of spiritual gifts. One thing that was apparently not understood about them seems to be related to another problem of boasting about who was greatest. Those with certain special abilities thought that they were for use in their own spiritual life and made them better Christians than others.

Paul answers that all of the gifts are for the purpose of benefiting, not ourselves, but others. They are for use in serving the whole church. If they are not used in a loving way that benefits others, they are worthless.

It is fitting that spiritual gifts are for use in serving others since they are given to us only because of Jesus who, even though he was greater than anyone, humbled himself in order to serve each of us. This is why he used all of his abilities to make sure that he suffered and died for us on the cross so that we can be forgiven and receive the most precious gifts of eternal life with him.

Please pray for us, praising God for choosing to give each of us gifts as He does, thanking Him for those who use their gifts to serve us and asking Him to help us all to have abilities, opportunities, and the desire to serve in ways that build up the church.

Culture Contrasts

One of the biggest differences between the culture here and what we have been used to is attitude about time. In the U.S. and much of western culture, people are very conscious about time. They expect things to start and end on time. Even those who are always late (we know who we are) are self-conscious about it.

People here are less time conscious. (Who knew Vance was always an African!) Punctuality tends to be a literally a foreign idea, even though leaders of events are often urging people to "keep time." At the starting time for something, such as worship, is when people will soon start sifting in gradually.

We have heard that if something is scheduled to start at a certain time it means that is when you stop what you are doing and start getting ready to go to that event.

Part of the reason may be the unpredictable challenge of knowing how long it will take to get somewhere because you don't know what could happen. In western culture, being late can be considered disrespectful to the people waiting for you. Here, being in a hurry to leave is disrespectful to the people you are with.

People wonder...

Do you work together with other Lutheran mission organizations that help provide resources?

This question was asked in response to what we have shared about our bringing books over from the U.S.

The answer is, "Yes." Lutheran Heritage Foundation, which translates and publishes Lutheran books in various languages around the world, has an office in Nairobi and prints books here, some in Swahili and some in English. We are able to get books from them for free, such as the Small Catechism with explanation, and distribute them to students. If you wonder about a question, email <u>vance.becker@lcms.org</u>


STEPHEN MINISTRY. MUMBERS Our Redeemer Lutheran Church

The Stephen Leader team estimates that Stephen Ministry at Our Redeemer Lutheran Church has provided about 2,165 hours of care.






Our Stephen Leaders have trained 42 Stephen Ministers to provide high-quality, one-to-one Christian care to hurting people in our congregation.


