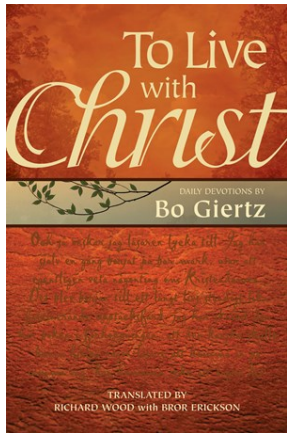

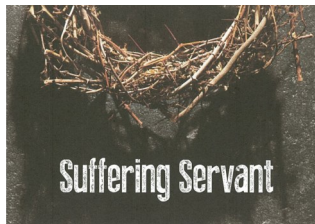

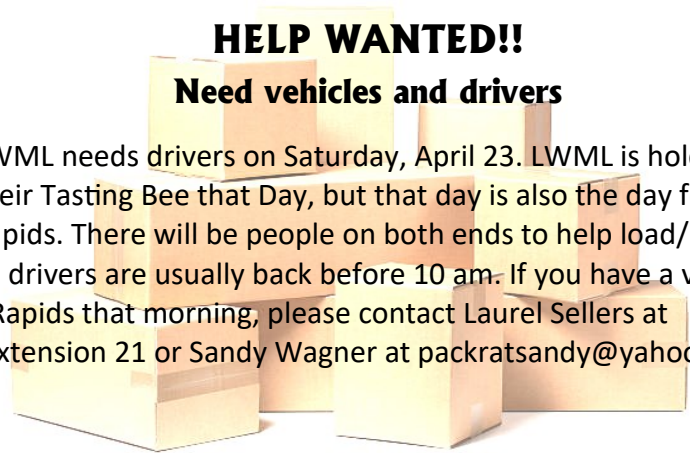
LWML Cedar Rapids Zone Spring Event
