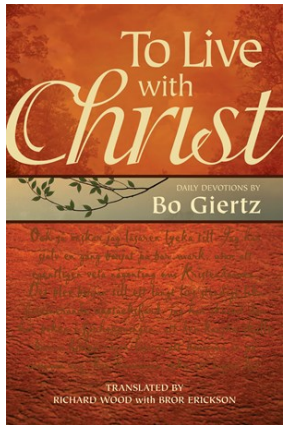

The 30-minute meeting starts at 9:00am.

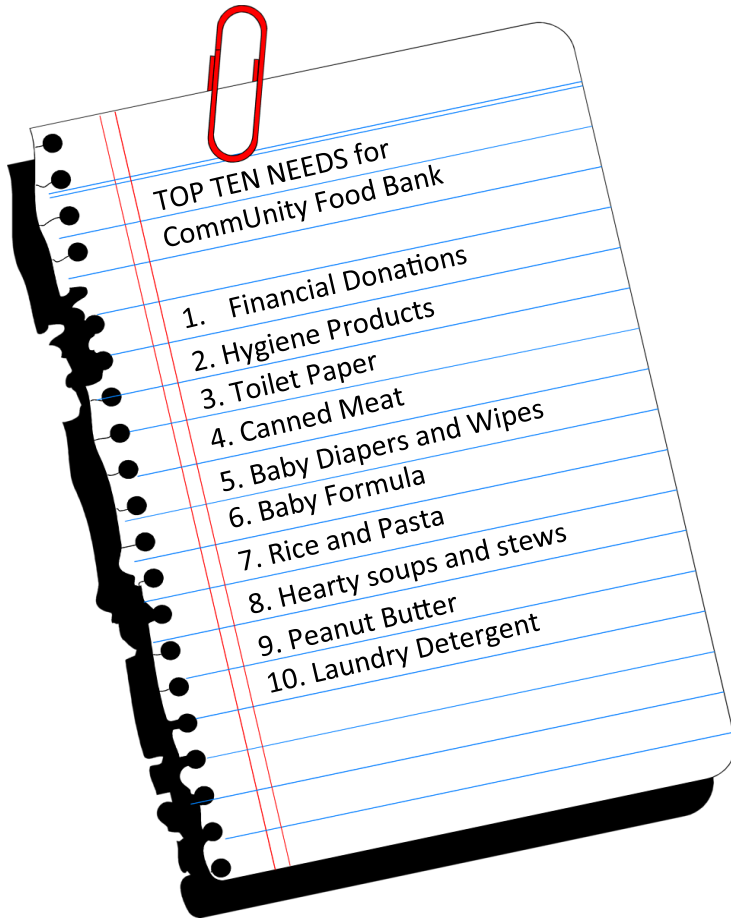
