To Whom It May Concern:

On Sunday, October 23, 2022 will be the 47th Annual Iowa City Road Races Run for the Schools. I am again asking for your patience this year with road closures and traffic delays. The three main races begin at 9:00 AM. There is a one-mile fun run for children that starts at 8:00 AM, on College St. only.

We have again contracted with the Road Safe Traffic Systems for re-routing on Hwy. 1 (between Burlington St. and Jefferson St). We have secured the Department of transportation request for temporary closure of Hwy 1 during the race. At 5:00 AM, College St. will shut down from Linn St. to Muscatine Ave. At 5:00 AM, Gilbert St. will be shut down from Burlington St. to Washington St. At 5:30 AM, Dodge St will be shut down and southbound traffic will be rerouted on to Washington St. At 5:30 AM, Governor St. will be shut down and northbound traffic will be rerouted on to Burlington St. The roads should all be reopened by 12:30 PM.

We are sorry for any inconvenience. Again, thank you for your patience.

# CLERGY APPRECIATION OCTOBER 22/23

The apostle Paul began the concept of clergy appreciation when he said in 1 Timothy 5:17, "Let the elders who rule well be considered worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in preaching and teaching". Paul

restated this concept in 1 Thessalonians 5:12-13 when he said that those who work hard among you should be held in the highest regard for their work. In 1992 Clergy Appreciation Month was started.

Shepherding God's flock can be difficult and lonely work at times. Many pastors leave the ministry each year.

There are many stories of men, in the Old and New Testaments who have experienced loneliness and weariness of ministry. In 2 Timothy 4, Paul said that no man stood with him, but Paul eventually came to understand that God was with him, even when he thought that he was deserted by men. The prophet Elijah sat under a broom tree and wanted to die. He later told God that he felt alone in his ministry. In 1 Kings chapter 19, God eventually showed Elijah that he had 7,000 supporters.

Pastor Appreciation Month was started to keep the pastors out from under Elijah's broom tree. Pastors are a blessing to their congregations and their families. On October 9 and 10, a basket will be available in the narthex for cards, notes of appreciation, and small gifts for Pastor Hartwig and Vicar Morgan Garrett.




#### A big "Thank You"!




