






## THE NEW ADULT MIDWEEK STUDY Begins January 25

#### The Rock Speaks

This Bible study invites you to explore how Jesus calls you to trust in Him as your rock and salvation, based on 1 Corinthians 10:4: "All drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ."

In *The Rock Speaks*, you don't need to be an agriculturalist to understand and grow as you study the words of Scripture. Drawing from the author's observations of rocks and soil, words from the Old Testament, and events in the New Testament, the study reveals how Jesus calls you into a deeper understanding of creation and salvation. Topics include sustenance, abundance, life, growth, and more. (10 sessions)


