

Jackets - jacket, sweater or hooded sweatshirt for boys and girls.


T-shirts - lightweight cotton t-shirts.



Flower Donation



***We are always running out of sleepers without feet or shirts/pants outfits we can use in place of sleepers for our baby kits.


***Please donate NEW or only <u>slightly</u> used towels--we don't want to send worn and tattered towels in our kits.




