

# **ESWATINI (SWAZILAND)**





## **MORE ESWATINI UPDATES**

Anita Nicholson traveled to Eswatini with University of Iowa College of Nursing students and faculty colleague (Kimberly Nuxoll) from March 10-26, 2023.

Faith community nursing in Eswatini is thriving. Our dear friends, Thandiwe Dlamini, and Jabulile Dlamini continue to regularly train nurses in faith community nursing. This training equips nurses to provide spiritual care in addition to their traditional nursing practice. These nurses focus on the intentional care of the spirit combined with improving the physical health of people living in rural areas that otherwise have limited access to health care.

The HIV/AIDS pandemic is on the decline in Eswatini with a marked decrease in new incidence of HIV (1.79 Incidence: prevalence ratio, UNAIDS 2022). Nurses and faith community nurses

take the lead in educating and counseling people to test for HIV and comply with antiretroviral (ARV) medication which can decrease the virus to undetectable levels, helping to decrease the spread. Pregnant mothers with HIV are taking ARV medication to help prevent the mother-to-child transmission of the virus.

Faith community nurses play an important role in educating youth on HIV prevention by connecting with them through the school system and churches. Their health education focuses on decreasing risky behavior that can lead to contracting HIV. In addition, they support creating positive activities for youth involvement. The youth at greatest risk for contracting HIV are between the ages of 14 to 18 years old, as they are out of school because of not being able to afford the tuition fees to attend high school. Primary education is free through 7th grade.

Jabulile Dlamini provides a great example of a faith community nurse creating positive activities for youth out of school. She coordinates community people to assist youth in learning skills to keep busy and earn money such as gardening, sewing, catering, building, and more. Jabulile's recent entrepreneurial adventure is helping the youth start a "piggery" to raise and sell pigs at the market. The money youth raise helps to pay tuition to return to high school.

Jabulile is constructing a youth center to hold skill-learning activities in a central location. She collaborated with the local chief (like a mayor) to obtain land and is continuing to work on fundraising efforts. Since loans are difficult to obtain, she is building in stages. She is coordinating with local contractors to train youth out of school to assist in making cement bricks and building. When more money is raised, more supplies will be purchased to make more bricks.

Anita will continue to keep you updated on the wonderful work of faith community nurses. Their next travel with the University of Iowa nursing students will be in November 2023. Please keep the Eswatini people and faith community nurses in your thoughts and prayers.
