

Flight have been replicated in luminous steel and dalle de verre glass by artist Alex Heveri. These amazingly life-like sculptures showcase an array of beneficial insects and pollinators including beetles, bees, dragonflies, and butterflies. The interaction of sunlight and the beautiful colored glass in these 20 pieces highlights the brilliant connectedness of light to plants, insects, the environment, and even us humans. How is light connected to you? Come witness the way light reflects on the beauty of the gardens gleaming with glass. **This trip is open to anyone in the congregation (male or female)** who is interested in going. INCLUDED IN PRICE:

1) Round trip airfare per brochure — deluxe motor coaches — First Class / Superior Class hotels — guided sightseeing — entrance fees to sites visited breakfast & dinner daily per brochure

2) Taxes and fuel charges totaling **\$695** USD comprised of **\$364.60** for fuel charges (subject to increase by airline up to 30 days prior to departure) and \$330.40 for taxes (including federal inspection fees for the U.S. Customs and Immigrations; international air transportation tax; agricultural tax; other per taxes imposed by government entities; airport taxes and fees including the September 11th Security fee up to \$10 per person, passenger facility charges up to \$18 per person, federal domestic flight segment fees up to \$3.50 per segment and U.S. and International arrival and departure, and other government imposed fees up to \$300 per person).

NOT INCLUDED IN PRICE:

Not included in your package are passports, visas, COVID-19 tests, vaccinations, laundry, lunches, telephone, mini-bar, alcohol, other beverages, and food outside of the contracted tour operator menu as presented at a hotel or restaurant (these extra items will be billed to you before leaving the hotel, or restaurant), airport transfers on non-qualifying flights, porterage at airports, travel insurance, excess baggage fees, any fees or fuel surcharges imposed by the airlines after the date you register for your trip, and all other items not specifically mentioned.

PAYMENT:

A full deposit of \$500 per person is required at time of registration. Credit cards are only accepted for the initial deposit. All other remaining payments must be made in the form of a check, including final payment. Final payment is due no later than 100-days prior to departure. Registrations received after 100-days prior to departure must be accompanied

by full payment. Registrations received between 90-75 days prior to departure are subect to a \$300 late fee. Tour pricing is based on a minimum group size of <u>20 passengers to be valid</u>. <u>The following supplements may apply for smaller groups</u>: 19-15 travelers, \$150 per person; 14-10 travelers, \$195 per person. If group size is less than 10 travelers the tour may be canceled due to lead of perior travelers, the tour may be canceled due to lack of participation. If final (full) payment is not received by *imagine* Tours and Travel, LLC (hereafter referred to as *imagine*) 75-days prior to departure, you will be automatically cancelled from the tour and your initial deposit of \$500 will be forfeited and different formations. additional fees may apply. imagine reserves the right to add a surcharge if the dollar declines by more than 2% against the shekel or euro based on foreign exchange rates in effect on date (06/15/23) when your tour was booked by your tour leader/church. All payments are required in US Funds.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is based on double occupancy (two persons sharing a room). When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. While *imagine* will try to match roommates, we cannot guarantee one will be available. Roommates may be assigned as late as 75 days prior to departure. If one is not available or if you request a single room, there will be a single room supplement charge of \$995 for the basic itinerary.

ITINERARY & CHANGES:

Because airlines often change flight schedules after brochures are printed, *imagine* reserves the right to shorten or lengthen the itinerary accordingly. You will be notified in writing when possible. If itinerary changes necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged \$195 per night/per person (single rooms \$225/ night). Meals for extra nights are not included. <u>Any changes and/or deviations</u> from the program and/ or departure city listed, by the passenger, must be provided in writing to *imagine* no later than 100-days prior to departure and any extra costs incurred will be billed to the passenger. All deviations are subject to a standard fee of \$150 plus any applicable airline fees. All tours are final at 70-days prior to departure. No changes and/or additions may be made to the tour after that time.

LAND ONLY:

Land Only price is \$4,137 per person. Price does not include international flights. Land Only passengers may be responsible for transfers and/or additional overnights incurred by booking their own flights. We recommend you purchase a ticket which can be changed without large penalties, as the group's flights may change. Passengers changing from the regular tour to Land Only after 120 days prior to departure will be charged a fee of \$150 per person.

AIRLINE TICKETS:

In order to keep prices low, imagine does not guarantee you will be on the most direct flights to your final destination. *imagine* also does not guarantee the group will be on the same flights, particularly if registering 100 days prior to departure. Flight routings are chosen by the airlines and not imagine. Airline tickets cannot be changed or refunded once issued. Air transportation to/from your destination will be economy class aboard IATA and ARC carriers utilizing APEX or SUPER APEX non-refundable, non-amendable tickets for groups of 10 or more flying together for entire itinerary. *imagine* is unable to use individual frequent flyer points to upgrade or accept them as partial payment for air transportation. Deviations by the passenger, from the group's scheduled flights, could result in different routings/air carriers. Airline changes, if allowable, made by the passenger after final payment has been made, may incur additional fees.

FLIGHT TIMES:

All flight times are subject to change by the airlines without advance notice. imagine is not responsible for such changes or delays and does not reimburse expenses resulting from such delays. If making your own flight arrangements to a departure city or any other portion of your trip, we recommend you purchase a ticket which can be changed without large penalties. All passengers are responsible for reconfirming their flights with the airline 24 hours prior to departure.

PASSPORT:

Each passenger is responsible for making sure that they have a valid passport that has an expiration date at least six months after the date of return from their trip. A copy of your valid passport must be submitted to our office by 100 days prior to departure.

VISAS:

Applicable visas will be obtained by *imagine* for U.S. and Canadian Citizens only. All passengers who do not carry U.S. or Canadian Passports will be responsible for obtaining visas to the countries they are visiting, imagine is not responsible for non-U.S. & Canadian Passport holders.

TRIP RESCHEDULING:

imagine and/or Trip leader reserve the right to re-schedule the dates of the Trip to future dates TBD due to governmental action, pandemic, or other circumstances beyond their control. Should that occur, all travelers will be rebooked for the new dates. Travelers unable to travel on the new dates may cancel their participation and will be assessed a cancellation fee of up to \$300 per person, plus any additional penalties/fees imposed by ground operator(s), airlines, or other vendors. Travelers can transfer to another available tour up to one year from their original departure date.

CANCELLATION FEES:

Any passenger cancelling from the day of registration to 100 days prior to departure will be charged a \$300 non-refundable administrative fee per person plus any airline penalties, if applicable. You will also be charged a single room fee if your cancellation forces your roommate into a single room from 75 days prior until the date of departure. The following charges also apply: 99-75 days = \$500; 74-55 days = \$1950; 54-41 days = **75% of total cost**; 40 days to day of departure = **100% of**

total cost. All cancellations must be received in writing. On or after the

day of departure there is no refund for any services not used. <u>We strongly</u> recommend you purchase travel insurance. If imagine cancels the tour due to lack of participation, there will be a charge of \$200 deducted from the amount refunded to each passenger for administrative fees plus any airline penalties if applicable. No changes may be made to the tour within 70-days of departure, as the tour is officially closed.

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


VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL NEEDS EVERYONE'S HELP



CROSS Information

As you may know, The Cross in front of the church has been deteriorating for several years and the time has come that an intervention is needed. The wood is deteriorating, and pieces have fallen off. Because of this, temporizing measures of securing loosening areas and inspections and maintenance to ensure safety are ongoing. It is time to begin planning and do something permanent.

The Cross was constructed and dedicated in 1969 and it has served our church well as an important landmark standing for Jesus Christ and what He did for us on The Cross. You may have had friends or visitors say that "your church is the one with the big Cross in front of it." It is an especially important image of what Jesus has done for us.

The original design includes three legs of support that suggest first the basic aspect of our religious teachings: The Triune God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The definition of church itself is The Word, the Pastor and the people. There are many mentions of threes in The Bible; the number three biblically represents divine wholeness, completion and perfection. Gideon asked God for three signs in Judges; three visitors appeared to Abraham (Genesis 18:2); Jesus answered the Satan's threefold temptations with three scriptural references (Matt 4:1-11). Jesus said, "Destroy this temple and I will rebuild it in three days." And, of course, we must include these three: forgiveness of sins, salvation and life everlasting. The number three is just one of the depictions of completeness and the examples in The Bible are numerous.

As part of the plan as we approach this project, it is important to maintain the architectural heritage and intent of the original design and in keeping with the appearance that complements and mimics the current structure knowing that an exact replica is not feasible given that other changes that may be needed to provide a more accessible and weather protected entrance that enhances and blends with the church structure.

Many congregational members have suggested that some type of entrance modification is desired so that worshippers may exit their vehicles and avoid inclement weather or slippery sidewalks, and possibly have a drive-through area. Most of the door closures are obsolete and a security plan is also in consideration. These are the concerns we hope to address, and the expectation is that this will be a major project. Our options might be dictated by space allowances and city regulations/ordinances, and these will be considered with future planning and discussion.

It is time to move forward and imagine how we can continue to make Our Redeemer Lutheran Church an inviting place to worship. In the coming weeks and months, we will arrange for events of imagination and dreaming to get input for what is desired much like what was done during Vision 2020 planning. That will be announced when we have reached that timepoint.

Please discuss among yourselves and with any Cross and Entrance Committee member what you feel is important in our Church to fulfill our mission, our motto and our vision. (Listed below).




