The mission of Our Redeemer Lutheran Church's Stephen Ministry team is to walk alongside people in our congregation who are going through a difficult time, focusing on a relationship that is caring, trusting and led by faith.

Stephen Ministers

A group of trained caregivers that are ready to listen, care for and encourage individuals. They will pray with you to help you through whatever you may be facing. The one to one pairing with a Stephen Minister is free and confidential.

Why is it called Stephen Ministry?

Stephen was one of the first lay-people commissioned by the apostles to care for the community of believers in Acts 6. Just as Stephen helped to meet the growing needs of the early church, Stephen Ministry expands the caring capacity of congregations. And just as Stephen shared the spirit of Jesus, so Stephen Ministry brings Christ's healing love to those who are hurting.

What are Stephen Ministers?

Stephen Ministers are lay congregation members called and trained to provide Christ centered, confidential, one-to-one care to people who are hurting and feeling like they are in a crisis.

What are Care Receivers?

Care Receivers are members of our congregation who receive care from a Stephen Minister. Care Receivers are people struggling through a difficult time in life - experiencing grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, family crisis, or some other life event. 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CROSS Information

As you may know, The Cross in front of the church has been deteriorating for several years and the time has come that an intervention is needed. The wood is deteriorating, and pieces have fallen off. Because of this, temporizing measures of securing loosening areas and inspections and maintenance to ensure safety are ongoing. It is time to begin planning and do something permanent.

The Cross was constructed and dedicated in 1969 and it has served our church well as an important landmark standing for Jesus Christ and what He did for us on The Cross. You may have had friends or visitors say that "your church is the one with the big Cross in front of it." It is an especially important image of what Jesus has done for us.

The original design includes three legs of support that suggest first the basic aspect of our religious teachings: The Triune God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The definition of Church itself is The Word, the Pastor and the people. There are many mentions of threes in The Bible; the number three biblically represents divine wholeness, completion and perfection. Gideon asked God for three signs in Judges; three visitors appeared to Abraham (Genesis 18:2); Jesus answered the Satan's threefold temptations with three scriptural references (Matt 4:1-11). Jesus said, "destroy this temple and I will rebuild it in three days." And, of course, we must include these three: forgiveness of sins, salvation and life everlasting. The number three is just one of the depictions of completeness and the examples in The Bible are numerous.

As part of the plan as we approach this project, it is important to maintain the architectural heritage and intent of the original design and in keeping with the appearance that complements and mimics the current structure knowing that an exact replica is not feasible given that other changes that may be needed to provide a more accessible and weather protected entrance that enhances and blends with the church structure.

Many congregational members have suggested that some type of entrance modification is desired so that worshippers may exit their vehicles and avoid inclement weather or slippery sidewalks, and possibly have a drive-through area. Most of the door closures are obsolete and a security plan is also in consideration. These are the concerns we hope to address, and the expectation is that this will be a major project. Our options might be dictated by space allowances and city regulations/ordinances, and these will be considered with future planning and discussion.

It is time to move forward and imagine how we can continue to make Our Redeemer Lutheran Church an inviting place to worship. In the coming weeks and months, we will arrange for events of imagination and dreaming to get input for what is desired much like what was done during Vision 2020 planning. That will be announced when we have reached that timepoint.




