

-It went great! I met the kids and the aunt that is caring for them. She actually called after I left and sounded teary. She found the gift cards and said she was wondering how to pull of a Christmas meal and was sooo thankful. I responded God is Good and she said "Yes, He is".

Here are some comments from the parents/caregivers of the children:

- -I can't wait for (my son) to open these presents from (my incarcerated husband) during our video visit together on Christmas! Thank you!
- -I would not have had anything to give my daughter this Christmas. I have no job, no money, I'm living in a shelter, I just got out of prison, my husband is in prison.... But I've been drug free for four months. I know God has a plan for me, and that's what I am holding on to. Thank you for coming to spend some time with us. I really appreciate it.
