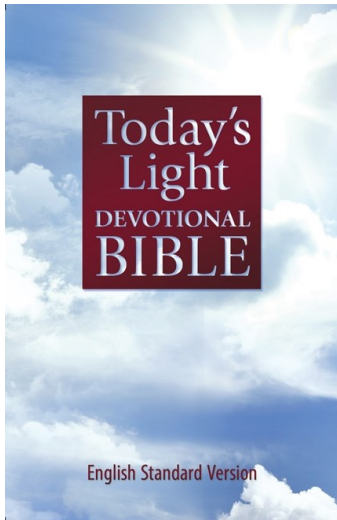

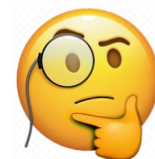

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ, Our Redeemer!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ at Our Redeemer Lutheran Church, Iowa City, Iowa, and Our Redeemer Lutheran Church, Marshall, Missouri, I am writing to let you all know that I received call documents this week from Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Marshall, Missouri, asking me to be their pastor.

I currently have two Calls from God and His church to serve in the Pastoral Ministry, one being my current Call to Our Redeemer Lutheran Church, Iowa City, Iowa, and another to Our Redeemer Lutheran Church, Marshall, Missouri. I did not ask for my name to be circulated to other congregations looking for a pastor. Part of the responsibility of our Synod's pastors is to be open to God's will and ask for the discernment of His Holy Spirit to consider the Divine Calls of our congregations. This process is standard for our pastors and congregations and provides us with an opportunity for reflection and prayer about the ministry of Christ, Our Redeemer.

I will consider this new call with conversation and prayer for the next week, and then I plan to announce my decision to all the congregations involved on Friday, March 8, 2024. At this time, I do not plan to make a trip to Missouri as part of the decision-making process. Instead, I plan to rely on the information sent and conversations by phone and Zoom.

I would appreciate hearing your thoughts and questions.

Please keep me in your prayers in the coming days as I decide whether to accept or decline the call to Our Redeemer Lutheran Church, Marshall, Missouri.

CALL PROCEDURES

How to Proceed When You Receive a Call

1. When you receive a call from a congregation, acknowledge it immediately, stating that you are giving it serious consideration. If the Mission Committee is a party to the call, send them an acknowledgment also.
2. Notify your district president, your circuit counselor (and if you are serving a subsidized congregation, your district mission executive) of the fact you have received a call. A copy of the letter acknowledging the call is sufficient for this notification.
3. Notify your present congregation of the fact that you have a call and ask for their counsel and advice, and solicit their prayers that the Holy Spirit may guide and lead you to make the right decision.
4. While the decision to decline or accept a call rests with you, it is well to seek the counsel and advice of your brethren in the ministry, district officials and members of your congregation. In your consideration of the call, try to determine what is best for your present congregation, the congregation that is calling you, as well as that of your family. The matter of where you can best serve your Lord should be of prime consideration. Unless there is some unusual circumstances, you ought to reach a decision within three or four weeks.
5. When you reach a decision, notify the calling congregation, your district president, your circuit counselor and your present congregation. (If you are serving a subsidized congregation, your district mission executive should be informed as well.) Share briefly the reasons for your decision. Again, a copy of the letter sent to the calling congregation is sufficient notification for the district.
