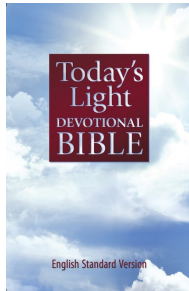

HURRICANE HELENE RELIEF

Kim Miller and her husband own a trucking company in Iowa City, and say they know they can help get donations to states like North Carolina and Tennessee, as long as their community stepped up to help them fill their semi-trucks. So they talked to their church, Cornerstone Community in Kalona, and started reaching out to see where donations could go.

“Everything that we are doing is going directly to a local church who is easing the burden of these people. And so its all going straight to people who are literally going to hand it to the victims,” says Miller.

On October 18th from 5-9 pm and October 19th from 8 am-4 pm, Cornerstone is hosting a “Fill the Truck” event where people can bring donations to the church and help load up the trucks before they leave for Tennessee and North Carolina on the 20th. And Miller says they are hoping to help even more.

“Three trucks, five trucks, 10 trucks. We are in contact with people in Florida saying that they are prepared to help with anything as long as we can get the donations,” says Miller.

Dave and Cynthia Fruendt are prepared to take items to Kalona so long as they are at Our Redeemer by end of day Thursday, October 17th. Below you will find items needed.

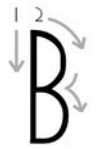

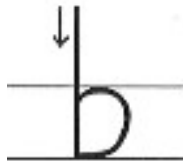
