January 18, 2026, 12:00 pm, Fellowship Hall


Everyone is invited to cheer on our three newlywed (or not-so-newlywed) couples. We need a studio audience to applaud their efforts to match answers.



The purpose of this mission trip is to explore and support Christian faith and spirituality as vital components of holistic care for the people of Eswatini.

We will volunteer with rural faith-based nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) that integrate spirituality and hope as they provide care to vulnerable communities. The church has supported these organizations through prayer and fundraising efforts.

Nurses provide health education, screenings, and referrals while addressing issues such as HIV, nutrition, and water scarcity. They partner with churches and community groups to improve access to care.

Eswatini Travel:


- **Physical Readiness:**

- Walking Ability: Be prepared to walk distances on uneven dirt roads in rural areas.
- Stamina: Expect hilly terrain and variable weather; moderate physical fitness is recommended.
- Footwear: Wear sturdy, closed-toe shoes for rough paths.
- Heat & Hydration: Carry water and stay hydrated; rural areas can be hot and humid.
- Flexibility & Balance: Some areas may require climbing into vehicles or navigating steep slopes.
- Medical Conditions: If you have chronic conditions (e.g., diabetes, hypertension), bring sufficient medication.

- **Health Recommendations:**

- Vaccinations & Preventive Care (make an appointment with a travel clinic)
 - Ensure routine vaccines are up to date (MMR, Tdap, polio, influenza).
 - Recommended vaccines: Hepatitis A & B, Typhoid, and COVID-19.
 - Malaria prophylaxis is essential for rural and lowveld areas—consult your healthcare provider for options (atovaquone-proguanil, doxycycline, or mefloquine).
- Food, Water & Personal Safety
 - Drink bottled, boiled, or filtered water; avoid tap water and ice.
 - Wash fruits and vegetables thoroughly; eat cooked foods when possible.
 - Carry oral rehydration salts for dehydration risk.
 - Use sunscreen, sunglasses, hats, and stay hydrated.
- Protection Against Insects
 - Use insect repellent with DEET or picaridin.
 - Wear long sleeves and pants, especially at dawn and dusk.
- HIV/TB Awareness
 - Eswatini has a high HIV prevalence; avoid exposure to blood or body fluids.
 - TB risk exists in crowded settings—limit prolonged exposure.
- Emergency Preparedness
 - Carry a personal medical kit (prescription meds, pain relievers, anti-nausea medications for travel on bumpy rural roads, bandages, antiseptic).
 - Have comprehensive travel insurance covering medical evacuation.

Plane tickets will be purchased in early February. Before departure, mission trip participants will attend a series of meetings designed to prepare them for the experience. These sessions will cover essential topics such as cultural awareness, health and safety guidelines, and strategies for promoting and supporting Christian faith as an integral part of care for the people of Eswatini. Participants will also learn about the nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) we will collaborate with, including their missions, community impact, and the roles volunteers will fulfill during the trip. In addition, these meetings will provide practical information on travel logistics, packing recommendations, and approaches for engaging respectfully with local communities. This preparation ensures that all participants are informed, confident, and ready to serve effectively during the mission.





Tuesday—We explored mixing colors. We started with our three primary colors: red, blue, and yellow.




Wednesday
