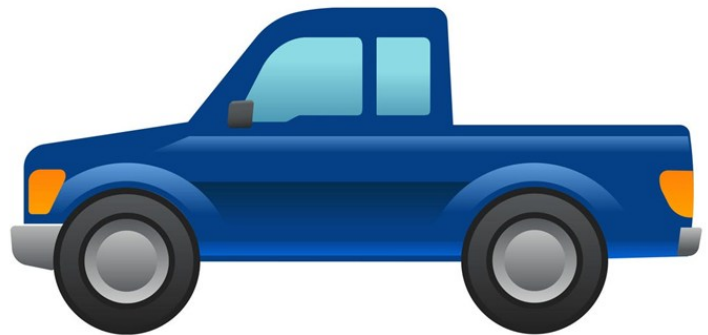
WANTED: TRUCKS FOR JULY 4 PARADE

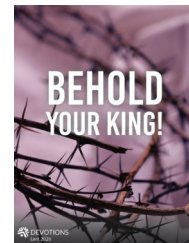
PRAYER WALK

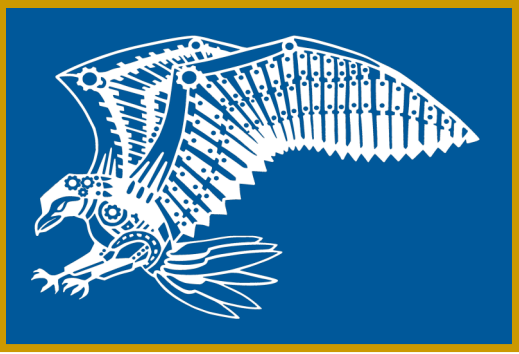

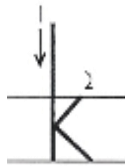

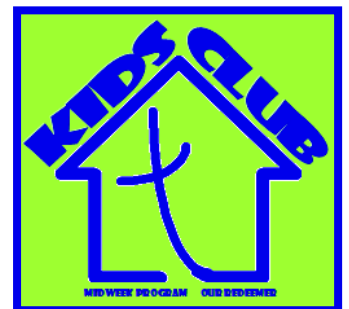
